## LOCAL ATTRACTIONS IN THE CANAL PARK AREA

**Lake Superior Maritime Visitor Center** - Film shows, model ships and other exhibits while you watch the boats enter the harbor and go under the Aerial Lift Bridge. Open 10am – 9 pm daily, No fee.

**Top Hat Carriage Service** - Enjoy an old-fashioned carriage ride in Duluth's Canal Park. These horse driven rides give you a tour of the Canal Park area and take you along the shore of Lake Superior. Open from early afternoon to after dark. Fees depend on number in your group.

**Great Lakes Aquarium** - Located on the waterfront with a hands on discovery center to explore the Great Lakes and beyond. Exhibits of fresh water fish and many other creatures and you can pet fresh water sting rays and sturgeon. Hours: 10 am – 6:00 pm. Fee - \$14.50, seniors over 65 \$11.50, ages 3-16, \$8.50 and under 3 – free.

**Lake Shore Scenic Railroad and Depot Museum** - History comes alive when several trains each day depart from the Depot for a trip through downtown, along the shore of Lake Superior and deep into the majestic North woods. This tour is fully narrated with the history of the area. Museum and train ride tickets are \$12.00 for adults and \$6.00 for children.

**William A. Irvin** - For more than 40 years, the S.S. William A. Irvin carried iron ore and coal to Great Lakes ports, often crashing through ferocious storms to reach her destinations. The Irvin set a record by unloading 13,856 tons of iron ore in 2 hours and 55 minutes using Hulett Unloaders. So c'mon aboard! Whether you're interested in a 2,000 horsepower steam turbine engine or delicate antique fixtures, you'll find them both in shipshape! The William A. Irvin is docked along the waterfront of Lake Superior next to the Duluth Entertainment Convention Center. Hours are 9:00 am-6:00 pm, Admission - Adults \$10.00, Students and Senior \$ 8.00 and children under 10 free with purchase of adult ticket.

**The Lakewalk** - This board walk is over three miles long extending along the shores of Lake Superior. There are many stops along the way with restaurants and parks. There is also a great malt shop down the way. You can rent bicycles and bicycle carriages to ride down this beautiful attraction. Also a great place to run or walk during those beautiful summer days. Visit the beautiful rose garden - a spectacular extension of Leif Erikson Park, Duluth's Rose Garden offers a beautiful arrangement of more than 3,000 rose bushes and other floral delights. There's also a fountain, a marble gazebo, an herb garden and plenty of benches overlooking the lake.

## ATTRACTIONS OUTSIDE OF CANAL PARK

**Park Point Beach** - Park Point Recreation Area is part of a long sand dune between Lake Superior and Duluth Harbor. The dense hardwood-pine forests, red and white pine forests, and sand dune beach habitats offer excellent opportunity for birding. Along with songbirds, look for common terns, and the occasional peregrine falcon. A public beach, a beach house with concessions, a short paved trail, picnic pavilions, playgrounds, recreational fields, and sand volleyball courts are all a part of the experience.

**Alpine Coaster** - Ride to the summit of Eagle Mountain with a leisurely chairlift ride, then hop on your sled and cruise down an exhilarating half-mile of twisting, turning track. You control the speed - take it slow or let it rrrriiiiiip! It is amusement park fun the whole family will enjoy in classic North Shore style. Open mid-May through mid-October 10am - 5pm. Fee- \$8.00 for one ride, \$12.00 for two on slide.

**Lake Superior Zoo** - Situated in Fairmont Park in West Duluth, the zoo sits on over 16½ acres at the base of Spirit Mountain. Hours 10:00 am to 5:00 pm. Fees \$9.00 per adults (13 and older), \$4.00 children (2-13) and under 2 –free.

**Gooseberry Falls** - On Hwy 61 40 miles NE of Duluth/12 miles NE of Two Harbors with a Visitor Center offering naturalist and interpretive programs, exhibits, restrooms & a gift shop. With 5 waterfalls and 18 miles of Superior Hiking Trails it is a beautiful place to hike and enjoy Lake Superior.

**Split Rock Lighthouse** - This Park is situated on the North Shore of Lake Superior. Perhaps best known for its historic lighthouse, this park offers numerous recreational opportunities. There is a park fee.
