The National WWII Museum

Designated by Congress in 2003 as the America's National WWII Museum, the campus includes the Louisiana Memorial Pavilion, showcasing the large artifacts of the war and exhibits on D-Day at Normandy, the Home Front and the Pacific; the Solomon Victory Theater, a 4-D theater showing the exclusive Tom Hanks production, Beyond All Boundaries; the Stage Door Canteen, where the music and entertainment of the "Greatest Generation" comes to life; the John E. Kushner Restoration Pavilion where staff and volunteers restore artifacts in public view; and the American Sector restaurant and Soda Shop — delicious onsite dining options by Chef John Besh.

New Orleans Museum of Art

Located in historic City Park, the New Orleans Museum of Art hosts an impressive permanent collection of almost 40,000 objects. The collection, noted for its extraordinary strengths in French and American art, photography, glass, and African and Japanese works, continues to expand and grow, making NOMA one of the top art museums in the south. The five-acre Sydney and Walda Besthoff Sculpture Garden at NOMA is one of the most important sculpture installations in the United States, with over 60 sculptures situated on a beautifully landscaped site amongst meandering footpaths, reflecting lagoons, Spanish moss-laden 200-year-old live oaks, mature pines, magnolias, camellias, and pedestrian bridges.

New Orleans Streetcars

Getting around New Orleans by streetcar is a great way to see the city. There are three different lines: St. Charles, Canal Street, and the Riverfront, each of which originates downtown but takes you to different parts of the city. One-way fares are \$1.25 and can be paid with exact change when you board. One, 3 and 5-day unlimited ride passes are also available for \$5, \$12 and \$20 respectively.

FACULTY

Chris Baglow, Ph.D. is from New Orleans, LA, and received his Ph.D. in Systematic Theology from Duquesne University in 2000. He serves Notre Dame Seminary as a Professor of Theology and Director of the M.A. Program in Theological Studies. Dr. Baglow's publications include: *Modus et Forma: A New Approach to the Exegesis of Saint Thomas Aquinas* (Pontifical Biblical Institute, 2002); *Faith, Science, Reason: Theology on the Cutting Edge* (Midwest Theological Forum, 2010); and several articles on the thought of St. Thomas Aquinas. He serves as Director of the Pope Benedict XVI Institute for Faith, Ethics and Science of McGill-Toolen Catholic High School, which offers seminars on faith and science (the Steno Learning Program) for Catholic educators. In May 2012, Baglow was elected to be a member of the Academy of Catholic Theology.

Phil Boyle, MD, CFCMC is Director of the FCCE (FertilityCare Centres of Europe), President of IIRRM (International Institute for Restorative Reproductive Medicine), Director of NaPro FertilityCare Clinics in Dublin and Galway. He has worked full time in Medical NaProTechnology for 15 years, and trained as a family Physician FertilityCare Practitioner, Medical Consultant and educator. Almost 2000 children have been born in Ireland through NaProTechnology since 1998. Over 300 of these were from couples with previous failed IVF. Dr. Boyle is married with 4 Children (4th one due in March 2013!) – aged 5 months up to 9 years.

John Brehany, Ph.D., S.T.L. has served as the Catholic Medical Association's Executive Director and Ethicist since September 2006. He is responsible providing direction on health care ethics and public policy issues, supporting membership and guild development, serving as media spokesman, and coordinating publications, advertising, and ongoing development of the Catholic Medical Association. Dr. Brehany received a Ph.D. in Health Care Ethics from Saint Louis University in 2003, a Licentiate in Sacred Theology from the John Paul II Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family in Washington, D.C. in 1991, and a M.A. in Philosophy from University of St. Thomas, Houston, Texas in 1987.
